
March 12

CCSF Emergency Response Timeline

In March of 2020 the world changed quickly. Lockdowns began, schools closed and our lives were turned upside down. When we asked for your help, you stepped up for our students and families when they needed it the most. It's been a winding road, but thanks to support from community members like you, CCSF was able to quickly pivot to address the most urgent needs in our school communities.

March 26

Provided funds to help the CCIC to produce PPE, helping make over **5,000** pieces of PPE



APRIL

April 1

Drive for school supples, yielding 4,000 supply kits for students.

April 3

District announces schools will remain remote the rest of the year.

MAY

May 1 \$15,000 given to support CCSD's summer reading programs, helping purchase 47,000+ reading materials.

May 26

Protests begin over the murder of George Floyd across the country.

CCSF secures \$50,000 in funding for the Students Organized Against Racism (SOAR) and renews our focus on equity and impacting ALL students.

CCSF works with CCSD's Title I Dept. & Homeless Liaison to provide emergency aid to families with urgent needs.

Internet Access Campaign launches and raises


\$108,000

Some CCSD students return to in-person learning either full time or hybrid, while others remain remote.


